



Middle East and Europe Region

In the Middle East and Europe (MEE) region, International Medical Corps currently operates in seven countries, accounting for a significant portion of the humanitarian organization's global portfolio.

As a global first responder, International Medical Corps relieves the suffering of those affected by conflict, disaster and disease, often in difficult and dangerous environments. We also deliver vital healthcare services and training that help communities move from relief to self-reliance. In 2025, across the MEE region, we served more than 3.5 million people, providing a range of integrated services and training in health, nutrition, mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS), child protection (CP), prevention and treatment of violence against women and girls (VAWG), food security and livelihoods (FSL), and water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH). We implement our programs in collaboration with national and regional governments, healthcare networks and facilities, other nongovernmental organizations (NGOs)—including local NGOs—and local communities.

Highlights

1 Gaza: We have established three fully functional field hospitals to provide critical lifesaving services to civilians affected by the war.

2 Iraq: In Iraq, we currently support Northeast Syria programs, but retain operational roots across all 18 governorates. Our programming integrates primary healthcare and community outreach along with MHPSS, CP and VAWG prevention and response services.

3 Jordan: As the primary UNHCR health partner, we work in the Azraq and Zaatari refugee camps, and operate Azraq Camp's only hospital, where we deliver comprehensive emergency obstetric and neonatal care, as well as emergency and general medical services. We also provide services to refugees living in urban settings.

4 Lebanon: We are the main health partner under EU funding, providing services aimed at reducing economic barriers to healthcare access throughout the country. We are one of the largest NGO providers of primary healthcare in Lebanon, supporting more than 40 primary healthcare centers and dispensaries, and leading mental health service delivery and capacity, aligned with the National Mental Health Program.

5 Syria: We have operated in Syria since 2008, first supporting Iraqi refugees and affected local populations and later expanding our work to respond to the needs caused by natural disasters and the civil war. We provide essential health and multi-sectoral services across most governorates through static facilities, mobile teams and community platforms.

6 Ukraine: Currently delivering multi-sectoral, complementary programming in Dnipropetrovsk and Kyiv oblasts, since February 2022 we have reached more than 11 million people throughout the country with lifesaving supplies, health services and training. We work closely with the Ukrainian Ministry of Health, other authorities and local partners to support recovery interventions and strengthen the health system.

7 Yemen: Operating in Yemen since 2012, we deliver integrated programs in healthcare; maternal, newborn and child health; MHPSS; nutrition; FSL; protection; and WASH services. We are a leading organization responding to outbreaks of cholera and other diseases, working in some of the country's most remote and hard-to-reach areas.

Healthcare

We provide free and comprehensive primary, secondary and tertiary healthcare, as well as specialized care such as obstetric, neonatal and pediatric care; physiotherapy; services related to maternal and newborn health; capacity building; and referrals to partner hospitals. In the MEE region, International Medical Corps runs health programs in Gaza, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Ukraine and Yemen, serving more than 2 million people across the six countries in 2025.



Nutrition

International Medical Corps works to prevent malnutrition and provide care for malnourished children by focusing on at-risk children under 5, pregnant and lactating women, and adolescents. In 2025, we reached more than 450,000 people in Gaza, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria and Yemen with our nutrition programming. Our nutrition services include screening for malnutrition; treatments for anemia and for moderate and severe acute malnutrition; infant and young-child feeding programs; and providing ready-to-eat meals. In Gaza, we have implemented the “Find and Treat” campaign in partnership with UNICEF and the Gaza and Palestine nutrition cluster to raise awareness, identify malnourished children and provide therapeutic food and services, and continue to screen and treat children for malnutrition.



Mental Health & Psychosocial Support

International Medical Corps provides MHPSS programming in Gaza, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Ukraine and Yemen. We emphasize the prevention and treatment of mental health and psychosocial issues through case-management services, individual and group counseling, psychological first-aid (PFA), psychiatric consultations and psychotherapy, referrals to specialized care, community outreach and awareness activities, capacity building and safe spaces. We also integrate psychological interventions and provide training in programs developed by the World Health Organization, such as Self-Help Plus, Problem Management Plus and the Mental Health Gap Action Programme. In 2025, we reached more than 63,000 people with MHPSS services.



Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

Our WASH programs focus on providing reliable access to clean water and modern sanitation, rehabilitating water and sanitation facilities, and promoting safe hygiene practices across refugee camps, communities, schools and health facilities. In the MEE region, we implement WASH programs in Gaza, Lebanon, Syria, Ukraine and Yemen, where we served more than 1 million people in 2025. We provide hygiene kits and infection prevention-and-control kits, as well as awareness-raising activities. We improve waste management; distribute potable water (through such means as water-storage tanks and purification systems); and rehabilitate and install water points, latrines, sewage systems, sanitation and water-supply infrastructures, and solar-powered desalination plants. In Yemen, which is especially at risk of cholera outbreaks due to damaged water infrastructure, we distributed 6.8 million liters of water in 2025.

Protection

International Medical Corps' protection services include helplines, assistive devices and specialized supplies (such as wheelchairs, Braille books, orthopedic and medical supplies), educational and cultural programs, and awareness-raising activities. We provide specialized services in CP and VAWG prevention and response that are deeply interlinked and integrated with our health and MHPSS services.

In the MEE region, we offer CP services in Gaza, Jordan, Syria and Yemen, helping children who are at risk or victims of violence, abuse, neglect, exploitation, child marriage, child labor or of being separated or unaccompanied. Some of the projects we implement include case-management services, individual counseling, parenting skills sessions, psychosocial support, youth-empowerment projects, PFA and safe spaces. We also strengthen coordination with other sectors, enabling them to make referrals internally and externally. In 2025, we helped 37,094 people in the four countries listed above.

Women and girls are especially susceptible to violence in conflict settings. In Gaza, Lebanon, Syria, Ukraine and Yemen, we provide awareness-raising sessions, safe spaces, case-management services, psychosocial support, emotional support groups, capacity building for local partners and more. We closely integrate our VAWG prevention and response services with health, MHPSS and CP services, reaching more than 82,000 people in 2025. We have also established strong referral networks for specialized care.



Food Security & Livelihoods

We focus on helping people with availability, access and stability of food supply, as well as how to maintain an income high enough to recover from conflicts and disasters. As part of our activities, we provide food baskets, unconditional cash assistance, cash transfers, "cash for health" programs, food and clothes vouchers, and vocational and life-skills training, and organize mass animal-vaccination campaigns.
